More likely to be diagnosed.

Less likely to get treatment.



Multiple myeloma is the most common form of blood cancer in African Americans

- Multiple myeloma is about 2X more common in African Americans vs White Americans. In fact, 1 in 5 people with multiple myeloma is African American
- Diagnosing multiple myeloma can be tricky in anyone. But the time it takes to get diagnosed is typically longer for African Americans
- African Americans are less likely to get certain treatments. However, when receiving the same treatment, African Americans do just as well as and sometimes better than White Americans
